



Cheaper the better!







Internet Safety





Anything you do in your digital life, can quite often stay around forever.

If you use the internet or even just chat to friends via text messages, you will have something called a Digital Footprint.

This footprint can show everyone else online lots about you.

That could be personal information about you. For example, if you take a picture or yourself standing outside your house. Now, anyone that can see that image, can possibly now know where you live.

If you were to post a picture that showed some personal information about you and then 5 minutes later you realised that you shouldn't really share that image, you could delete it, but if others had already seen / screen shot or even shared that image, it would now be impossible to take back (fustification to the same should be same sho

The same goes for sending a friend a private text message or posting something into a group chat. Once it has been sent, if you change your mind later, it's again too late to take back. That text, group chat post, private conversation, picture or video can now easily be shared without your permission and everyone out there could now see it. That could be upsetting / embarrassing for you or possibly even get you in trouble one day.
